
Since we had a flood in our storage facility, we moved to a new location that has much easier access, probably won't flood, and is located in Prescott Valley, so it is close to our new meeting location.

OBSERVATIONS & CONTROVERSIES

Spuria iris come in a variety of sizes of plants and inflorescences. With my four planted in same location from same supplier in Sept., 2016, one year later the new, autumnal growth varied from 'Vintage Year' at 8 inches to 'Sonoran Sunset' at 28 inches. Now my spuria leaves have mostly died back, although watered throughout the dry Fall. Advice for growing Spurias also is extremely varied. Some suggest withholding watering in the summer for the dormant period, but that is our monsoon season and last July we experienced some rain every day. In Camp Verde, Spuria aficionados water them all summer and let the plants go dormant when the irrigation ditch water is cut off in December. It will be interesting to observe the plant growth and bloom times in the newly planted beds at the R. Marcusen Sculpture Garden at Yavapai College, where water is cut off during freezing weather. We cannot be disappointed if it takes the new Spurias a few years to become established because we will be rewarded with no need to divide them for many years to come. Please share any tips you have about Spurias.

My observation about all the dwarf bearded iris is that they require much more frequent watering in my clay soil than do iris with large rhizomes. I am considering placing 8 cement blocks around a new bed of 'Bumble Bee Delite' and 'Sarah Taylor' and covering them with a window screen during much of the year, to protect them from wind & drought, just as I do with my cold frame of that size, which grows leaf lettuce all year around, with the addition of a plastic cover in the winter.

My historic iris germanica developed 7 increases from a small rhizome planted after our PAIS rhizome sale last summer. None of the large Tall Bearded iris rhizomes from modern hybridizers could match that vigor.

2018 PAIS Public Gardens Cleanup Projects

We have received numerous thanks from Yavapai College, Embry-Riddle, Sharlot Hall, the Citizens Cemetery / Yavapai Cemetery Association and the public for what PAIS has and is doing in our community to bring beautiful spaces for the public to enjoy with our irises.

With the onset of warmer weather and spring just around the corner the irises at our public gardens will need some annual care. They are all doing very well but will need some general clean up to have the dead fans (leaves) and bloom stalks taken off. We will also need to apply fertilizer at times. Below are the garden coordinators and contact information along with tentative dates for garden maintenance. If you can assist please contact these individuals. We will also pass around some signup sheets at the meetings before the cleanups so we know who can assist. We count on our members to assist with these annual cleanups in these Gardens. If you are unable to kneel you can still assist by bagging the iris fans and leaf debris, sweeping or raking as we do the cleanup.

This year we will also begin a rejuvenation and replanting program in the Sculpture Garden to amend the soil and replant the existing irises, adding new Dykes Medal winners along with completing collections in the honor gardens. Depending on conditions, the gardens may only need minimal cleanup on these days

Although CC is not a PAIS garden, we have assisted the Yavapai Cemetery Association with one thinning of the historic irises a year for the past five years. This year we will do this one more time in May before the last Memorial Day service to be held in the Cemetery. The irises we dig are used in our school education program and our sale to help support the Cemetery Associations Rehabilitation Program. In July this year the Cemetery Association will cease to exist and the Historic Citizens Cemetery will be turned over to Yavapai County. It is not known at this time if we will have any further involvement with the Citizens Cemetery after July of 2018.
